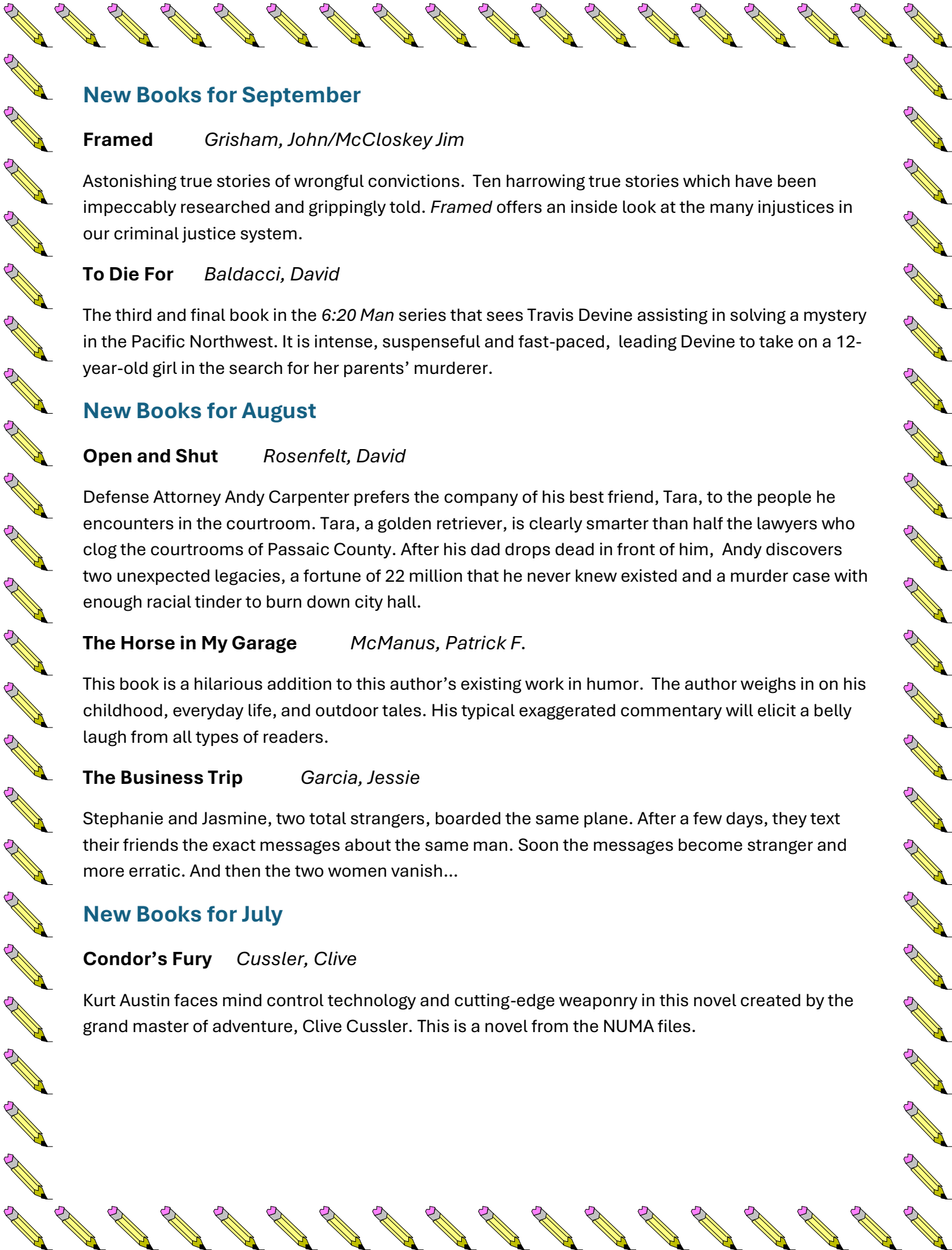




New Books for September

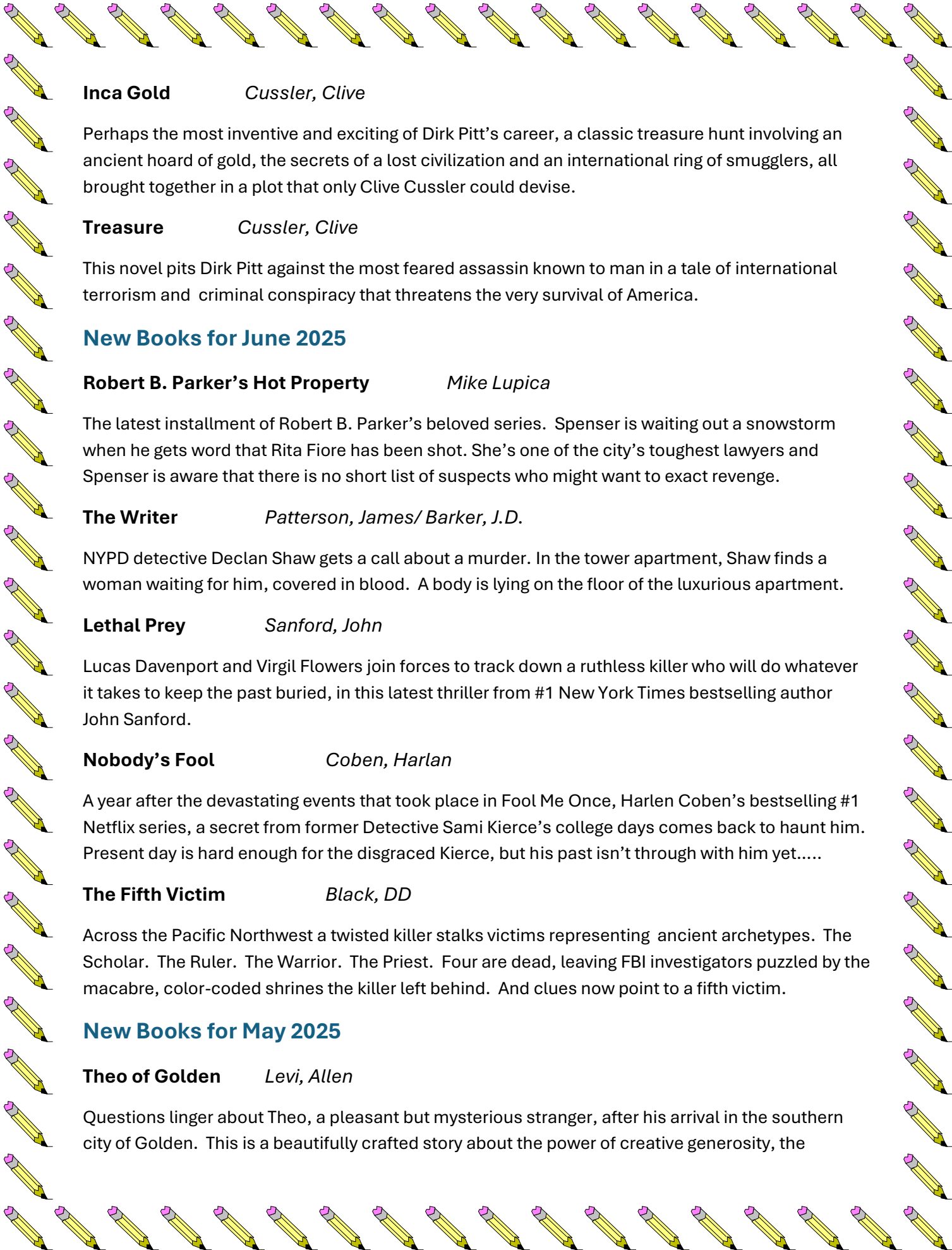
The Business Trip *Garcia, Jessie*

Black, DD

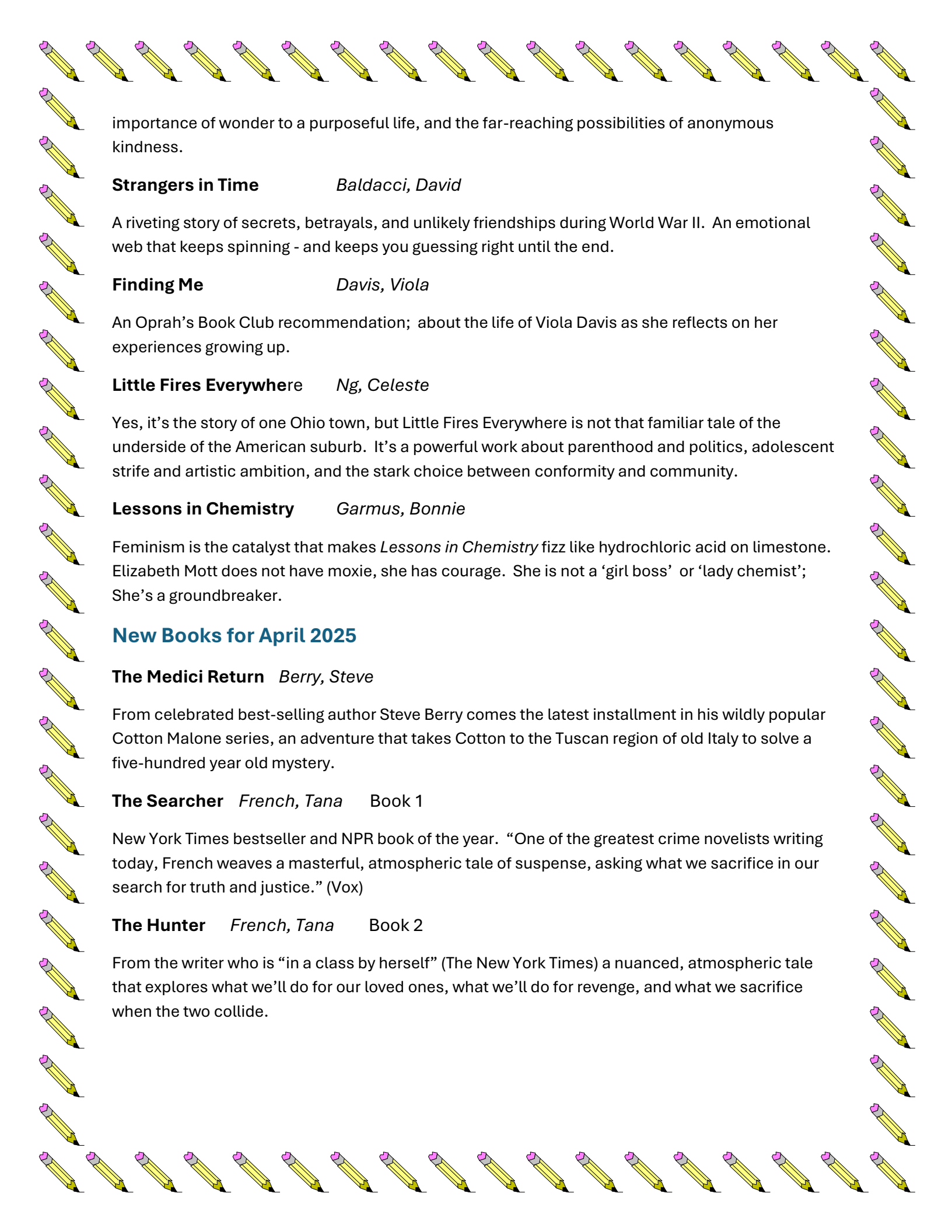

The Medici Return *Berry, Steve*

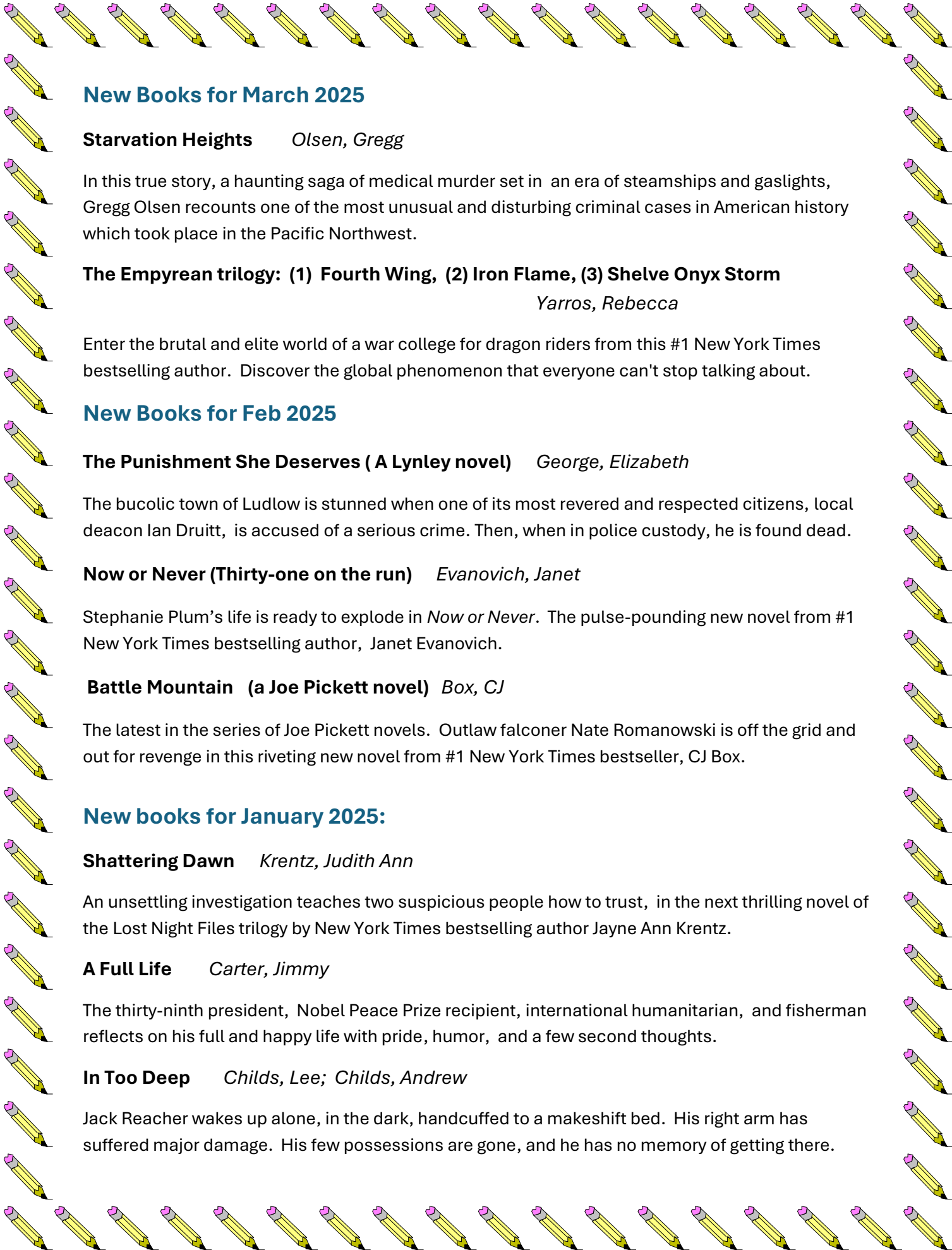
